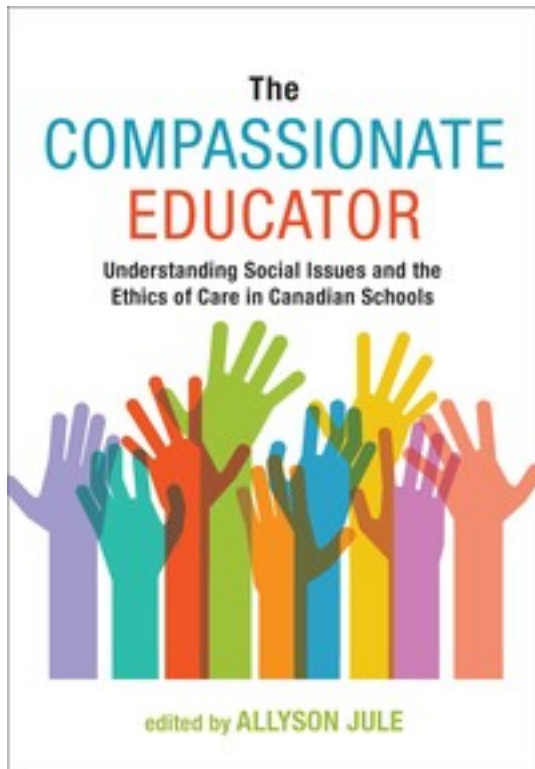


# The Compassionate Educator
