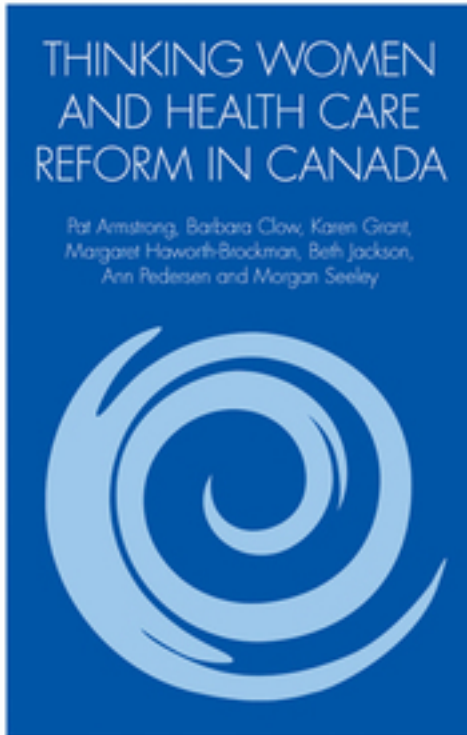


Thinking Women and Health Care Reform in Canada
